I have a list. (Defeats redacted – you'd expect nothing else.) Sir Richard a valiant knight, without mercy, a good man.

You sit there in your brown robes thinking — is this man witless?

Can he remember these things truthfully? Older than Noah...

....I loved my Bercellette.... She was the best one — we hunted together in the King's Forest — a great honour... the deer...the boar...

Fields fertilized by so much blood grow good grain: so all that gore gave a just reward, all those lives not dead in vain; Halidon Hill, a vengeance, we chopped and slashed

He was there, his shield azure.
Crecy, we slew thousands,



Devon County Council

Change afoot for how local services are delivered throughout Devon.

The government wants to abolish two-tier local authorities, where responsibilities are split between county councils, district, city and borough councils, and to replace them with single unitary authorities, bringing all services under one roof.

What's changing?

There are several tiers of councils in Devon, and the structure changes depending on where you live.

Currently, Devon County Council handles services like education, transport, and social care, while district, city and borough councils manage housing, planning, and waste collection.

Under the proposed reorganisation, a single unitary authority would take on all these responsibilities for a specific area. It means that the number of councils in Devon will be reduced, with district councils and Devon County Council ceasing to exist and unitary authorities, which combine services, formed.

Why change?

The current system of local government has served Devon for many years. However, increasing financial pressures, rising demand for services, and the need to work more closely together have prompted the government to re-evaluate how local councils are structured.

Earlier this year the government asked councils across Devon to explore how local government could be restructured to better serve communities.

<u>Our new Leader, Councillor Julian Brazil, isn't particularly impressed with the process,</u> but says it does give us an opportunity to look at how services are delivered.


Have your say

At the heart of this process is a commitment to doing what's right for Devon, and the voices of its people are essential to shaping what comes next.

We want to hear from you on what should be considered during the reorganisation of Devon's councils and services, and what matters most to ensure the best possible outcomes for people in Devon in the years ahead.

NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met in the Memorial Hall on Monday 4th August 2025.

The Parish Council spent £1,402.01 from the main account, nothing from its Reserve account and £1,197.07 from the Footpaths account. The District Council as part of the Local Government Reorganisation process are asking Parish Councils to consider what services or assets they wish to take over, the only asset Mid Devon have in the village is the Play Area behind the garages at Greenaway and so the Council will be considering this item at their next meeting on 8th September.

The Government are also making large changes to the National Planning Policy Framework which appear to remove local consultation in favour of developers. The Parish Council intend to discuss a Strategic Plan also at their next meeting on 8th September.



Moths - what to see during the day

People tend to characterise butterflies as bright and colourful and moths as dull; in many cases this is just wrong. We have a number of butterflies in this area whose markings are a neatly understated brown on brown. There are some awesomely colourful and strikingly patterned moths, though, admittedly, because of a moth's wing position, they are able to choose when to show off their brightest colours. Moths tend to hold their wings either layered over each other and flat or spread out and flat, whereas a butterfly's is either upright together or flat and apart.

Butterflies also have clubbed antennae compared to a moth's feathery ones.

The antennae are particularly useful as an identifier - if you can see them. The general rule that butterflies fly in the day and moths at night can be as inaccurate as using colour as a separator. Whilst it is generally true for butterflies, there are a number of moths who are diurnal, or daytime moths. They tend to be more colourful (on the hind wings at least), and are often a



Hawk moths such as the hummingbird hawk moth (*Macroglossum stellatarum*) are distinctive daytime moths, once seen never forgotten, given how like tiny hummingbirds they can appear. They appear to be becoming resident rather than migratory here.

Striking scarlet marked, dark moths in the day could be Cinnabar (*Tyria jacobaeae*) named after the red mineral, or the six spot burnet (*Zygaena filipendulae*). The burnet name a variation on brunette for very dark brown. Their warning red reflecting that they not only taste bad but are poisonous thanks to the toxins their larval form eat.

Another big moth family which has diurnal members is the tiger moth family.

The Jersey Tiger Moth (*Euplagia quadripunctaria*) in particular was once common, but for many years hasn't been known outside of small pockets (Devon and Channel Islands), then occasionally it started being seen in London, and other spots in the mild climate of the south coast. This year the warm spring has led to a boom in numbers in lots of new areas. There are definitely a few in the village this year. Have you seen them? Have you left a wild area for them to lay eggs so we can have lots more next year?



Morchard's Weather

I hope you all are still enjoying ice cream. The weather has been nice - a good summer. On July 11th, I measured 31C (88F) and there was quite a lot of rain on July 22nd which greened things up again. Odd days have been cooler though. On Aug 10th, the temperature ranged from 7C to 27 C (45F to 80F) - quite a difference during one day.

On Aug 10th, we had a superb full moon - The Sturgeon Moon. The Sturgeon Moon gets its name from the large fish of the same name that were supposedly easier to catch around this time of year and which served as an important source of food for several Native American tribes. It is also the last full moon of the summer, heralding longer, cooler nights.

Aug 12th was also the peak for the Perseid meteor shower, which happens each year. The Perseids are caused by the Earth slamming into the debris left behind by comet 109P/Swift-Tuttle. The average speed for a Perseid meteor is 36 miles per second. The air in front of the meteor is squashed and heated to thousands of degrees Celsius, which is what we see.



Folk Tales Corner

Global Choir

There is a kind of folktale that starts with the phrase "It was a bright morning and all the birds were singing", It is very much up to the individual storyteller to elaborate if they wish. Most of us don't, we have action, plot and characters to get on with and everyone knows what the dawn chorus sounds like don't they. But maybe we should take a moment to consider this experience.

If you are ever feeling a little adrift, like time is rushing headlong in to a future that has no connection to the systems or rituals of the past, or even your youth, if you ever feel that modern life has made us so mobile and so technologically connected that you are losing touch with the physical world, Just wake before dawn and listen for an hour.



Every morning there is an audio phenomenon: anthropomorphised as a co-ordinated choir singing together, the dawn chorus has neither conductor nor composer, being a totally freeform expostulation of... who knows? Do the birds sing with unbound joy at another new day or are they just complaining loudly that their knees hurt? It's not just song birds singing, I grew up next door to a collection of geese, ducks, chickens and the like who all had something to say each time the sun came up, which could as easily have been demands for food as comments on the glory of the solar deity. I may be projecting, but they mostly sounded pretty narked that someone had turned on the light again. Different birds wake up at different times, adding their voices in turn so it sounds as if there is some sort of arrangement: rawks of rooks, explosions of jackdaws and the repetitive "hur Hur, hwerr, heyr heyr" of pigeon all rise and fall, dominating the sound picture for a few minutes before moving on with their day.

For us it starts in darkness and ends in light, then it's gone for another twenty three hours. But being a product of the rotation of the earth the "singing" has simply moved on a few miles round the globe... and It keeps on going, like an audible Mexican wave rolling around the continents as they turn towards the sun. It doesn't end, it just surfs on, a continuous breaker of awakening circling the globe in a never ending blast of ornithological effusion. Mammals get in on the act sometimes as well, in our towns it's mostly the odd opinionated dog, out in the forest entire troops of howler monkeys make sure no one sleeps late!

Devon & Cornwall Police

Livestock Offences

I am sad to report that over the last few weeks we have had a couple of livestock related incidents which I want to highlight to our communities.

One incident is in relation to an allegation of a sheep being chased off a cliff near Newquay Cornwall on Sunday 27th July. This incident has been widely reported on social media and there is a police appeal in relation to this which can be found here- News-Article-Devon & Cornwall Police -anyone with any information about the incident is being asked to contact Devon and Cornwall Police.

On a separate note, but still sticking with the livestock theme, we have had a small number of incidents of livestock being stolen within both Devon and Cornwall over the last few months, some with 20-50 sheep being taken in one night. It is known that suspects know how to handle sheep and are likely to be operating in hours of darkness using trailers to move livestock. It is possible they utilise a dog, but this is not confirmed at this time.

We would encourage anyone who sees any suspicious livestock movement at night (or day) to call police on 999 and provide information such as location, vehicle involved, type of trailer and a registration plate if possible. I am sure we will all agree that we would rather the police attend a completely innocent livestock movement than turn up at a field in the morning and find a large number of stock missing.

Never put yourself at risk by confronting suspects-call 999!

Earthquakes

The recent earthquake centred on the Kamchatka Peninsula in Russia triggered tsunami warnings across the Pacific.

Tsunamis erroneously called tidal waves can be caused by earthquakes, landslides or meteorites, but not by tides. Equally, they have nothing to do with the weather.

The Earth is essentially a massive ball of very hot rock, much of which is molten. After its formation about 4.5 bn. years ago it started to cool down. Rather like a hot bowl of custard, the Earth has cooled to form a crust on its surface. Today we recognise two types of crust - thin, but very dense oceanic crust beneath the sea, and thicker but lighter continental crust forming the land masses.

Beneath the crust, in the Earth's mantle, convection currents rise from the Earth's core. As they reach the surface they spread out (diverge), cool and sink back to the core. This divergence of convection currents splits the crust above dividing it into seven large parts called plates, and numerous minor plates and many more micro plates. Sinking convection currents converge with other currents causing plates to move together. Sometimes the plates will slide past each other.

If free to move, these plates would typically go as fast as a person's growing fingernails. Not very fast, but over long periods of time considerable distances could be attained. However, these plates are not free to move as all plates will come up against another plate. Essentially pressure builds up until something gives. It is the rocks comprising the crust which fracture in long lines called faults. Starting from a central point (the focus*) in the Earth's crust the rock will fracture in two directions at the speed of a bullet. It is this fracturing that is the earthquake. It is sometimes possible to see these fractures in sedimentary rocks at the coast where waves have eroded the coastline to form vertical cliffs. Hartland Quay has some good examples. The buckling (folding) of these cliffs is part of the same process.

SUSTAINABLE MORCHARD

As the rock shatters it sends shockwaves through and across the Earth. There are two main types of seismic (earthquake) waves: body waves, which travel beneath the surface of the Earth, i.e. through the Earth's interior; and surface waves that travel across the Earth's surface. Body waves can be primary waves or secondary waves. Primary waves travel faster than secondary waves and have a pushing motion, rather like a line of cars crashing into each other on an icy road. Secondary waves tend to move from side to side, rather like a snake. The most important type of surface wave is Rayleigh waves, these have a rolling movement rather like the waves on the ocean, these are the most destructive waves.

Earthquake waves travel from one side of the Earth to the other. A major earthquake makes the Earth wobble like a jelly. An earthquake in, say, Japan will result in a seismic wave passing through London. The vertical wave movement could be up to one metre in height. However, it takes several hours for the wave to pass and so buildings rise and fall so slowly no damage occurs. Close to the epicentre however, the waves pass in a matter of seconds or minutes, so buildings rise and fall rapidly.

* The point on the Earth's surface immediately above the focus is called the epicentre.



Built on the site of the dilapidated Union Road toilet block, between the War Memorial and Bike Shed, the Park House could offer amazing opportunities for local and national performance groups and bring many more events to our area, including theatre, cinema, dance, comedy and live music. It would transform our park and regenerate our town centre.

Crediton and its surrounding villages are important and vibrant communities in Mid Devon. But Crediton is expanding and to

avoid it becoming a dormitory town for Exeter, we need to provide the spaces and facilities to ensure that people can choose to spend their leisure time locally and that our community continues to thrive.

The project is being led by the Crediton Heart Project, with support from Crediton Town Council and Mid Devon District Council. The Heart Project is a volunteer led charity, set up in 2018 with the key aim of developing a new community venue. Since then we have been exploring possible sites and running a range of successful projects such as the Crediton Heart Project community website, an annual Summer Arts Festival and, most recently, the Kick Start Art project for children.

Last year the Newcombes Meadow site became available so we commissioned a feasibility study by award winning theatre designers, Foster Wilson Size. They concluded the site could accommodate a 300-seat professionally equipped theatre suitable for a wide range of performances and events. The Park House hasn't been designed yet, but this is a computer generated image of what it could look like.



This is a hugely ambitious project with the potential to benefit everyone in our community. But before we take the next steps we need to know what people in the town and surrounding villages think.
