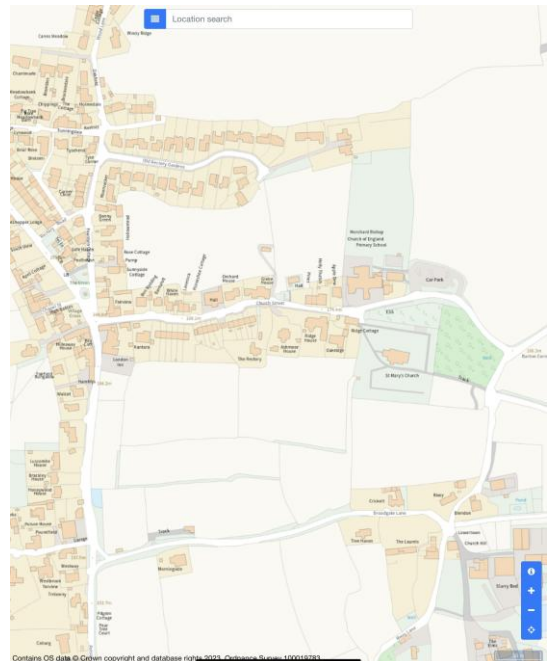
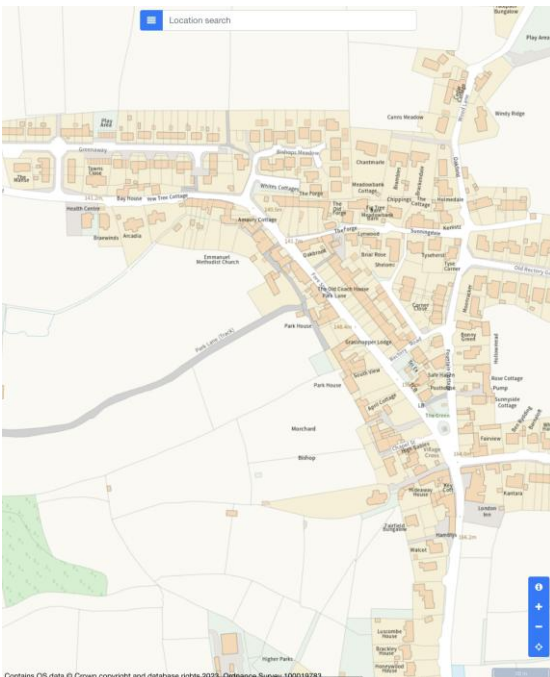


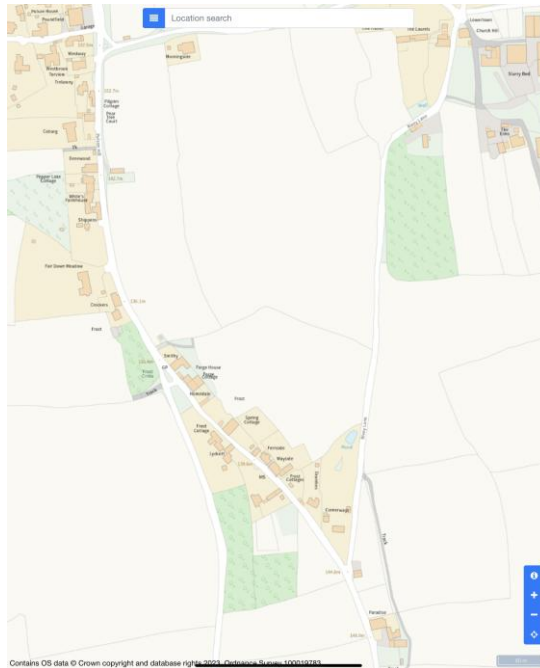
Intro

Our beautiful village of Morchard Bishop is set high on a hill with stunning views in every direction. The surrounding countryside is a patchwork of arable and pasture land separated by ancient hedges and stone walls. The air is full of birdsong, cattle moos and sheep baas as well as the usual sounds of a thriving village going about its daily life. The Two Moors Way [long distance route from Dartmoor to Exmoor] runs right through the village.

Welcome : whether you are new to the village or have lived here for decades, we hope that this collection of village/parish information will be helpful to you. It will be reviewed each year to try to keep it as up to date as possible.

Helpful inf:

Refuse, recycling, cardboard, food waste: collection day for the village centre is usually a Monday. Exceptions are when there are Bank Holidays. The yearly calendar can be found on the mid Devon DC website. <https://repository.middevon.gov.uk/Calendars/MondayW2C2.pdf>

Food waste [small blue bin] is collected weekly. Recycling [black bin 1 for plastic and metal, black bin 2 for paper and glass and green bin for cardboard] are collected fortnightly. The garden waste [brown bin [paid service] or compostable bags available from Adams Hardware in Crediton] is collected fortnightly too. The black bin for household waste is collected every three weeks.

We also have cardboard recycling in the metal shed at the back of the pub car park.

GP and pharmacy- we are extremely lucky to have a wonderful surgery and pharmacy in the village. If you phone at 8.30am and queue for a bit, you almost always get an appointment that day. This is not the experience of most people trying to use GPs across the country.

Bus. We are served by the 369 bus. This is a regular service and a lifeline for many people. It can be caught down at Greenaway opposite the surgery or at the war memorial.

Train: roughly 2 miles away at Morchard Road, a GWR train between Exeter and Barnstaple - hourly Mon-Sat. Four trains each way on a Sunday.

Pub: another wonderful asset in our village is our pub, The London Inn. People come from miles around to enjoy huge portions of delicious food made by Sarah and Emma. A wide range of drinks including local tipplers are served by Carrie and her team. It is truly at the heart of the community, and we are extremely fortunate to have it on our doorstep. It even has a skittle alley and a moderately successful skittles team-The Londoners! Tel 01363 877222. It is closed all day Mondays. and Tuesdays.

Post Office-a mobile post office comes to The London Inn each Friday lunchtime. They are there from 1.30-2.30pm so you can grab a drink or some food whilst you wait. The next nearest post offices are at Copplestone, Sandford and Chawleigh.



St Mary's Church- 'St. Mary's Church in Morchard Bishop is a historic parish church with origins dating back to the medieval period, and it stands as a key landmark in the village. The present structure, predominantly built in the 15th century, reflects the Perpendicular Gothic architectural style typical of that era, though there are elements of earlier construction.' The church, dedicated to St Mary the Virgin, stands on the highest ground in the village with spectacular views North to Exmoor and South to Dartmoor. It is the Midway point of the Two Moors Way, the long – distance footpath across Devon.

Chapel -the Emmanuel Methodist Church has been in the village since 1846. It can be found at the bottom of Fore St on the left. It is a very friendly and active church. It has a large regular congregation each Sunday- service starts at 11am but tea/coffee and biscuits are served from 10.30am. It has thriving Sunday School groups and youth activities on Friday evenings, catering for both primary and secondary school ages. The minister is Rev Peter Brown. www.emmanuel-morchard-bishop.org

Memorial Hall- found in the centre of the village on Church Street, the hall was built in 1931 to honour villagers who had lost their lives during military conflict. It has a large hall with markings for pickleball and a large stage. It has up-to-date audio-visual equipment. There is a smaller room at the back which is used for coffee mornings and a meeting room upstairs.

The village Library is housed in this room with an excellent selection of modern books and jigsaws for both adults and children. Books can be taken and returned or taken and kept. Book swaps can take place at a dedicated session on the first Weds in the month from 3pm-4.30pm [when refreshments are available] or at any time when the hall is open. The hall hosts regular Saturday coffee mornings from 10am-11.15am [run by village organisations as fund raisers] and on the 2nd Saturday of the month it hosts a Market where local food producers, craftspeople and charities come together to sell their wares. Bacon sandwiches are on sale as well as tea/coffee. There is a raffle at all Saturday morning events.

Playing field – we are very lucky to have a large playing field with a fenced children's play area [including new equipment purchased this year], an elderly tennis court suitable for recreational tennis and a bowls club. The playing field estate including the Sports Club building and changing rooms/pavillion is run by a charitable trust. It hosts a very enjoyable and successful Vintage Rally and Fair on the 1st Saturday in August each year which raises much needed funds for the running of the estate. Defibrillators- we are very fortunate to have 4 defibrillators in the village. One is at Frost by the old forge. The others are on the wall of the pub skittle alley on Church St, on the wall of the Chapel and on the wall of the Sports Club building. They are checked monthly by a member of the PC. None of them need a code to open the cabinet. Remove it from the cabinet, switch it on and follow the instructions that it gives you. Take your phone with you when you get it if you have called 999. Vintage Rally and Fair-this annual fund-raising event for the Playing Field Association is held on the 1st Saturday in August. Flower and Produce Show -This event takes place in a large marquee at the playing field on the 2nd Saturday in August. The schedule of classes can include 'best single rose', 'six sweet peas', 'a jar of marmalade', 'cheese straws', 'best embroidered item', floral art, a children's bug hotel. There is usually a class judged in situ eg best garden feature which encourages nature to flourish. Classes are cheap to enter. Judges are local, friendly 'experts'. Refreshments are available. Open Gardens/flower festival- St Mary's Church organise these two events on alternate years as fund-raisers. The Open Gardens event sees lots of visitors looking with wonder and envy at beautiful village gardens. We can wander in, chat to the owners, ask questions and generally have a lovely time in someone else's garden! Refreshments are served at the Memorial Hall.

The Flower Festival harnesses the creative talents of the village. Artistic floral displays on a set theme are shown off in the beautiful church. Refreshments are served in the Memorial Hall.



Sustainable Morchard-the aim of this group is to raise awareness of the environment and our impact on it whilst offering practical solutions. They hold seed and plant swaps to reduce wastage, they organise talks from experts eg hedgehog, swallows, tawny owls. They also organise glass recycling for the sports club.

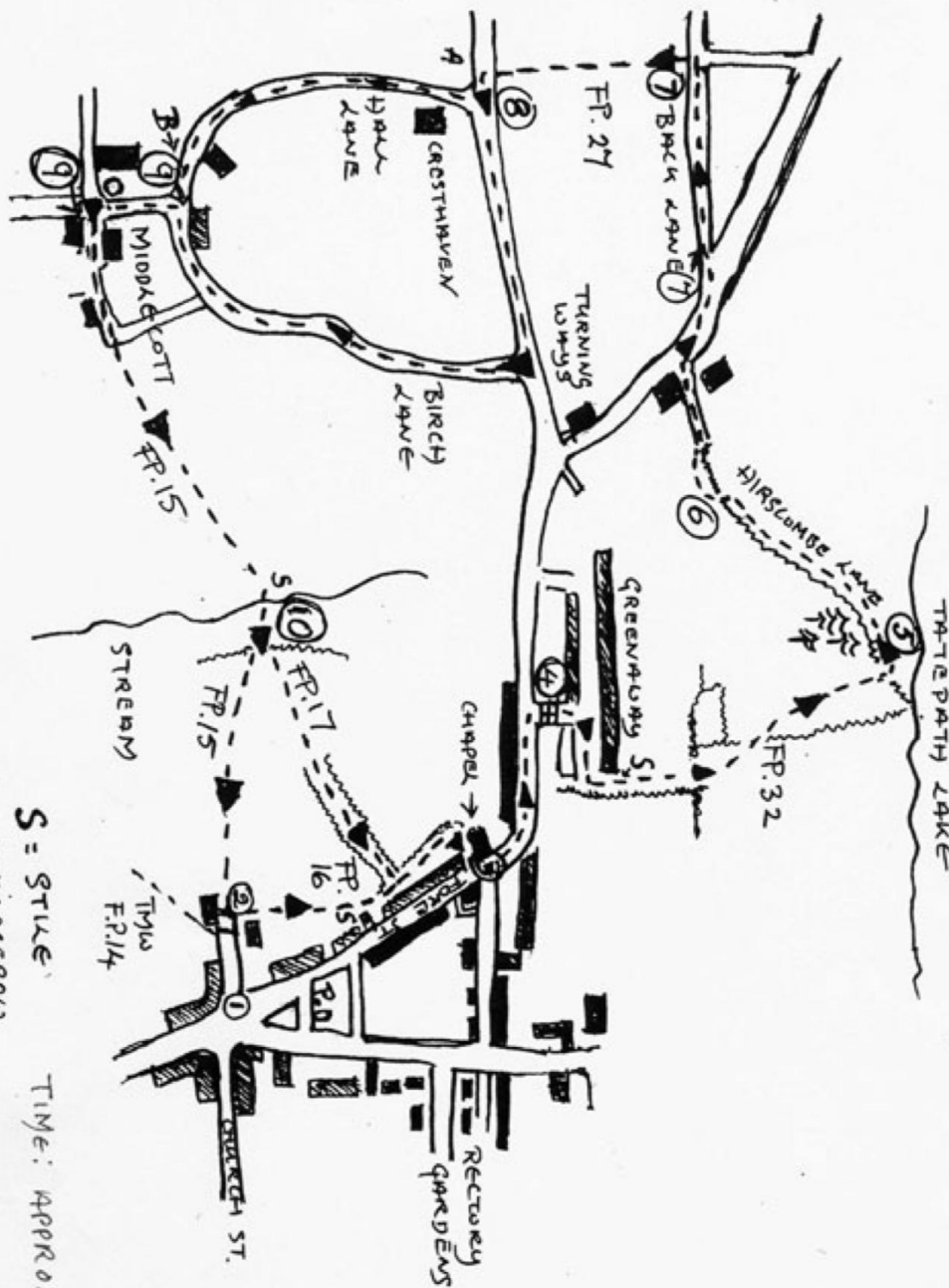

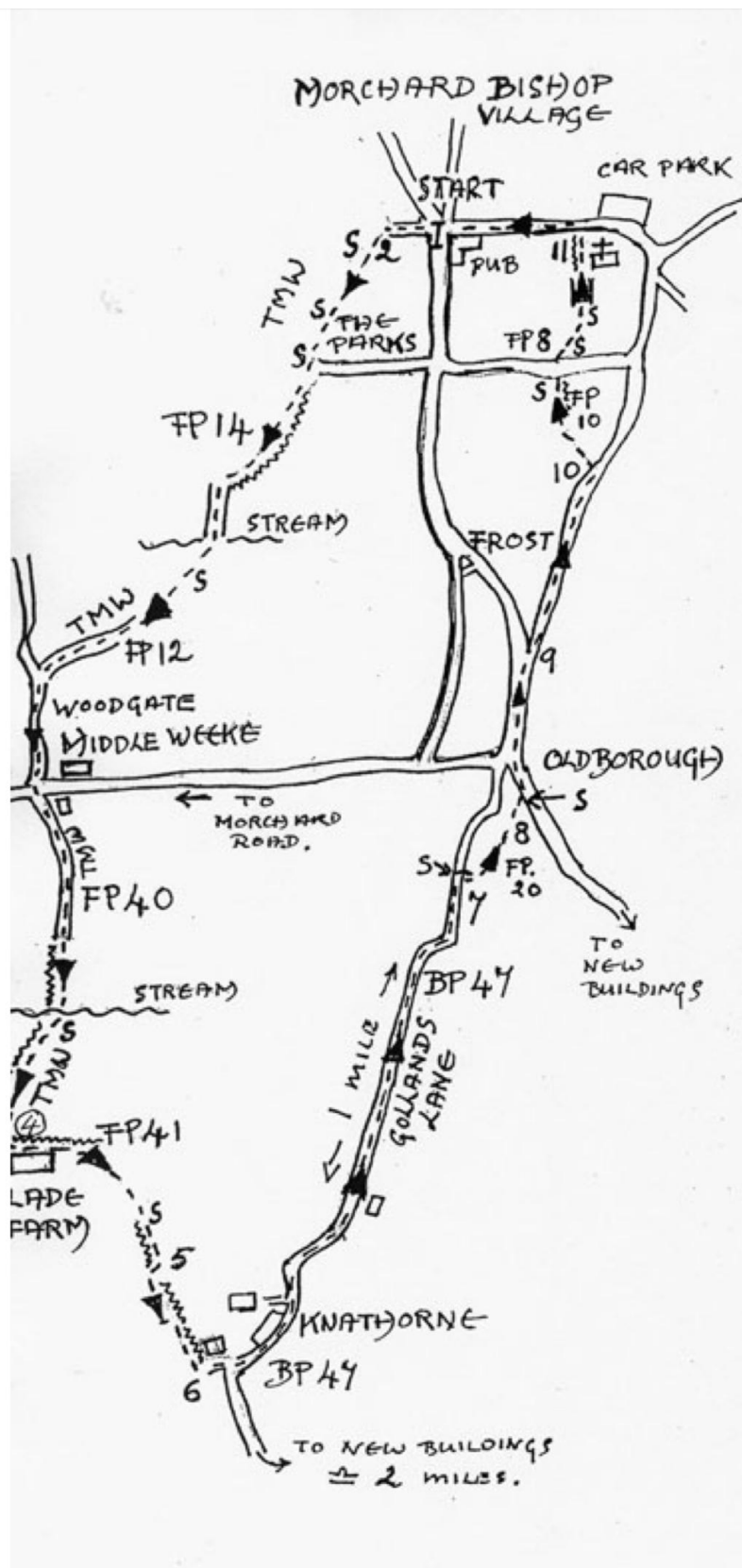

MORCHARD BISHOP WALKS — NO. 2

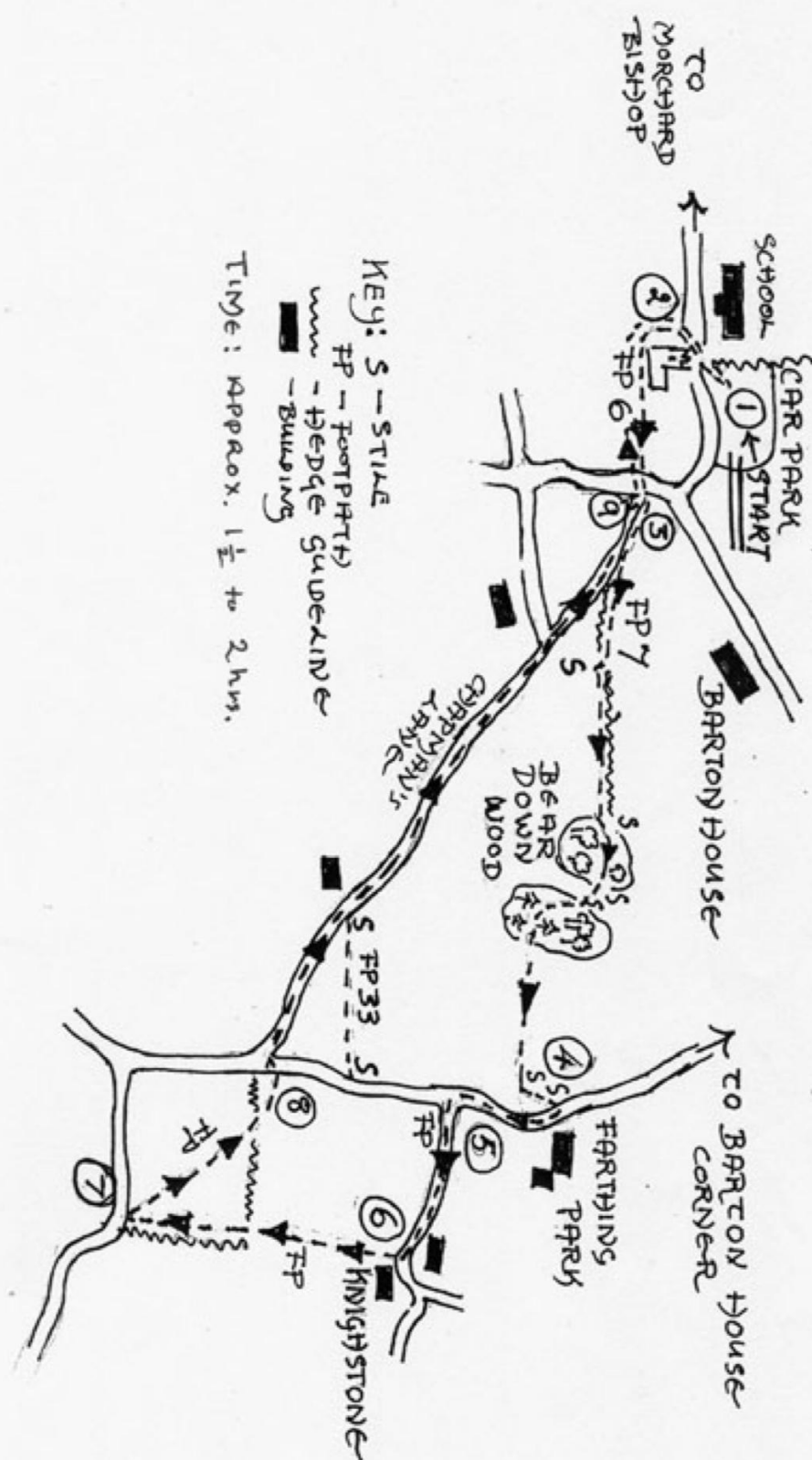
MAP (not to scale)

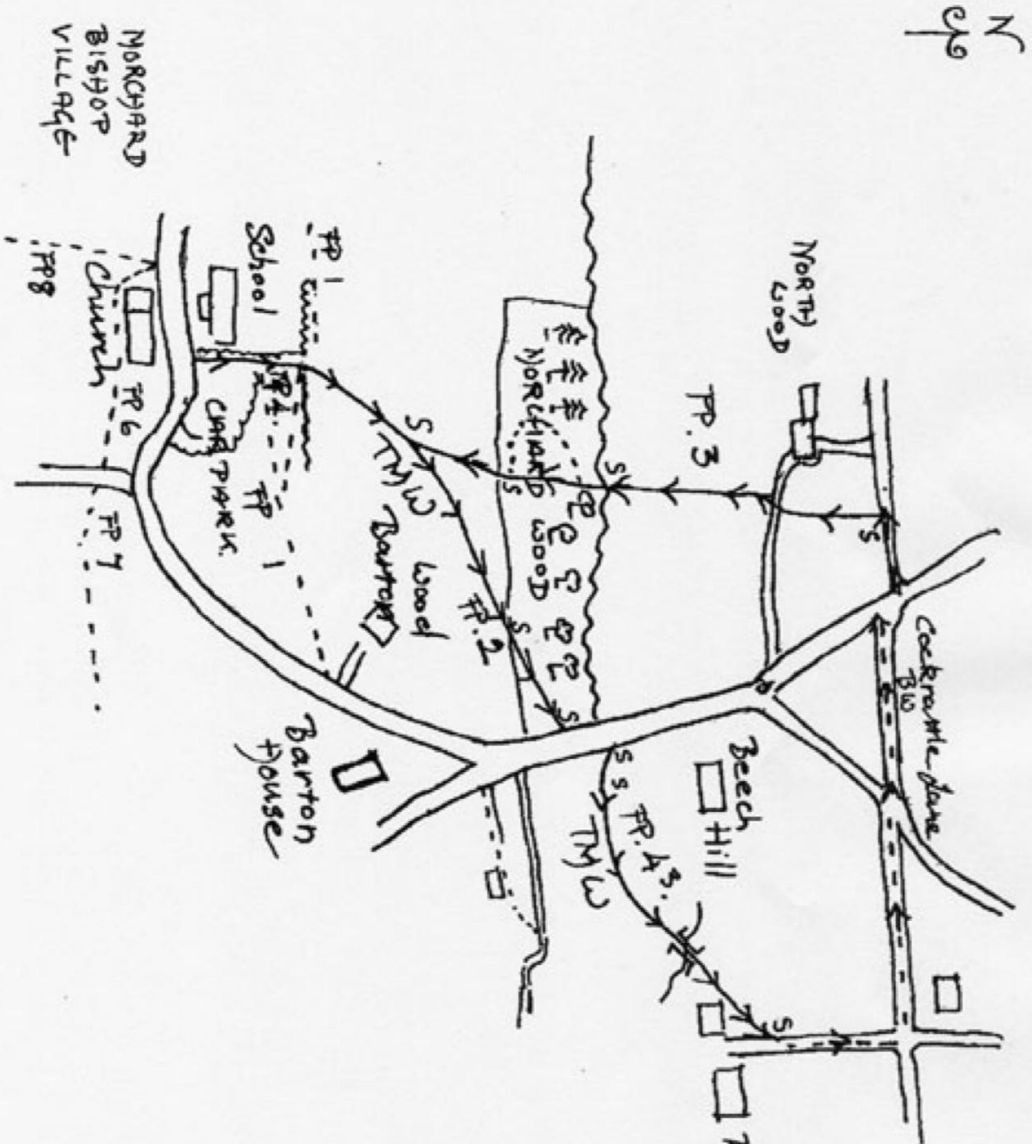

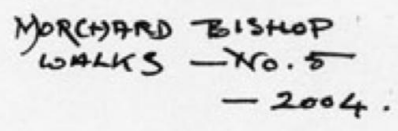

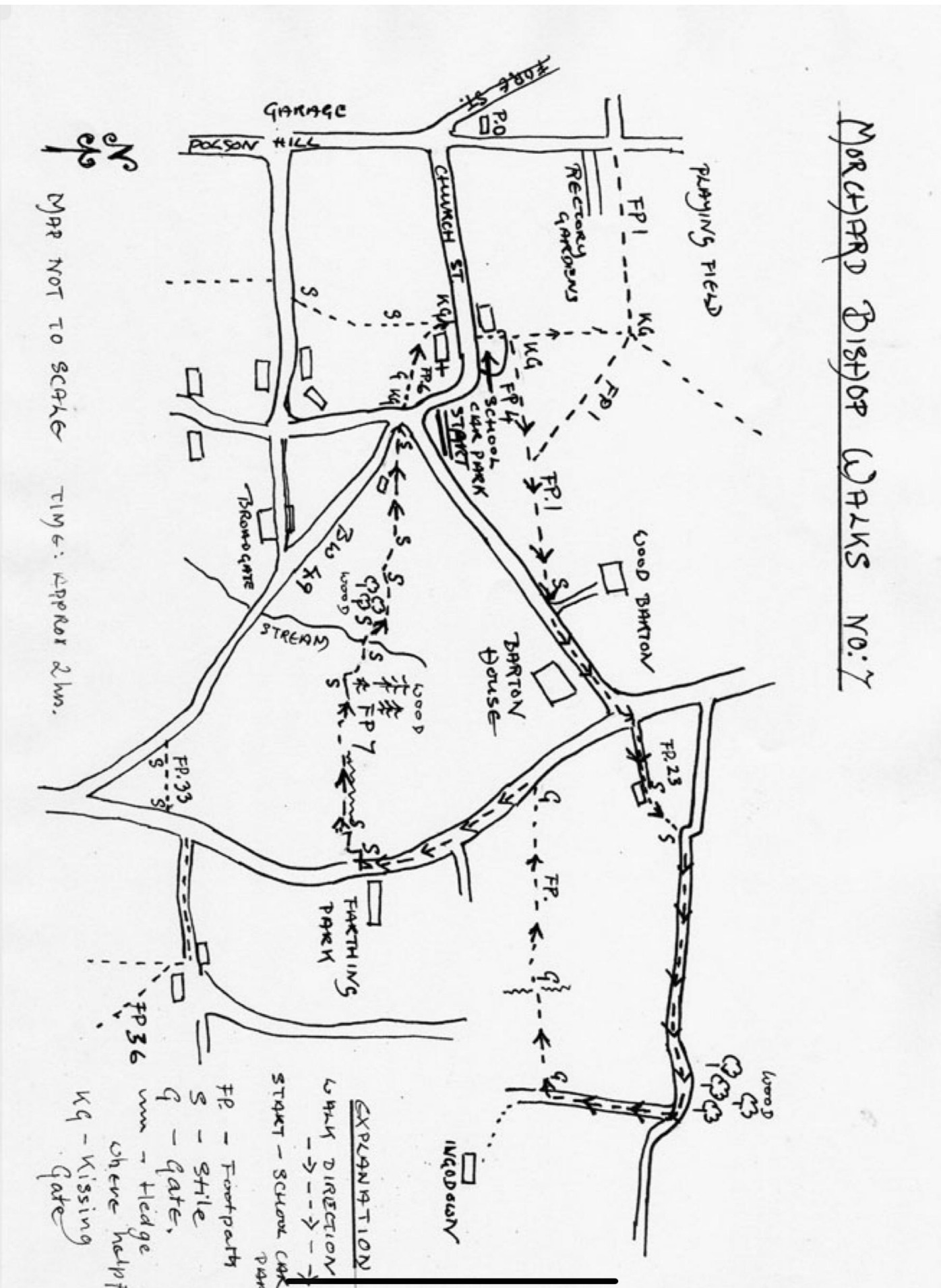
DIAGRAM MAP - NOT TO SCALE,

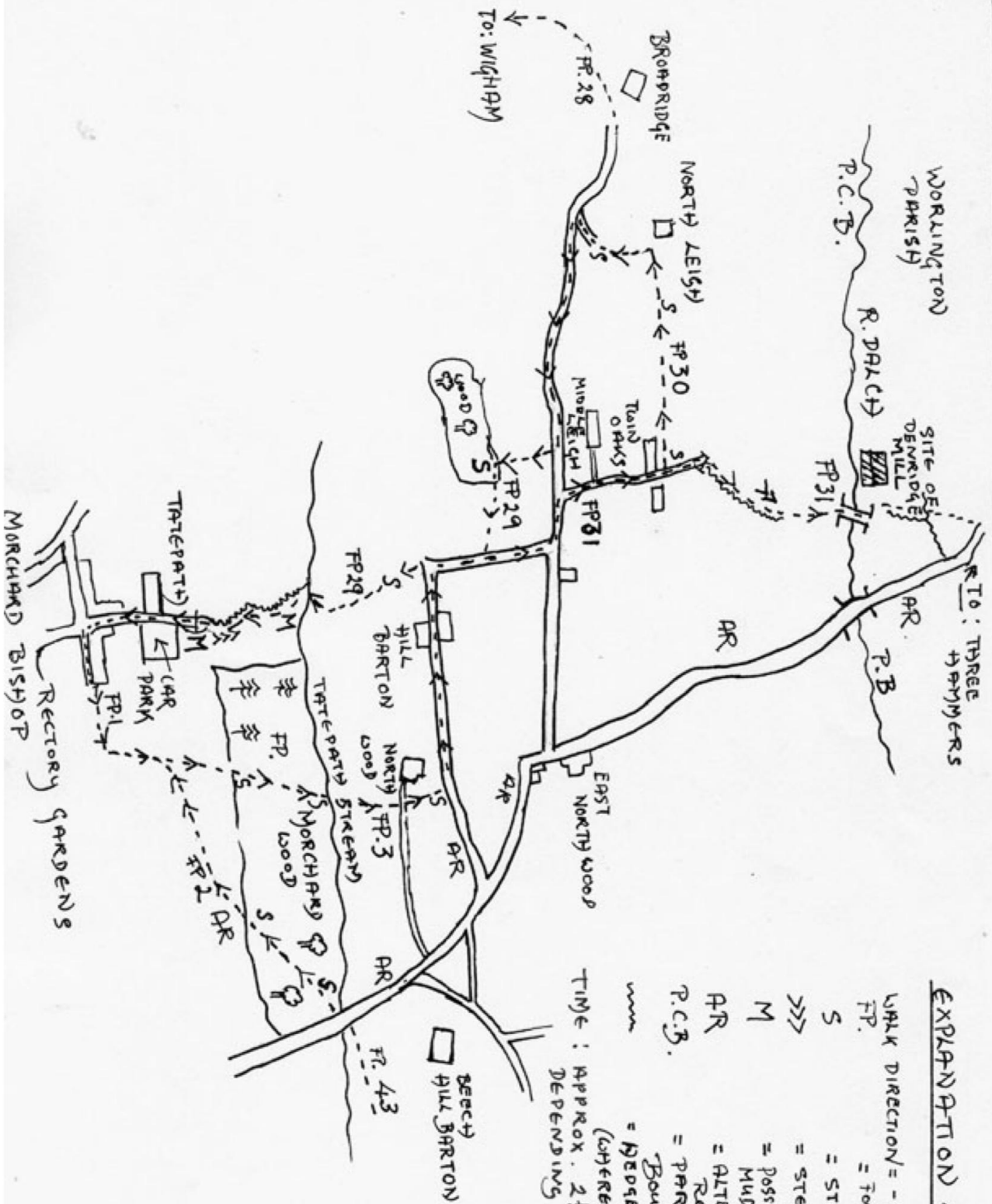

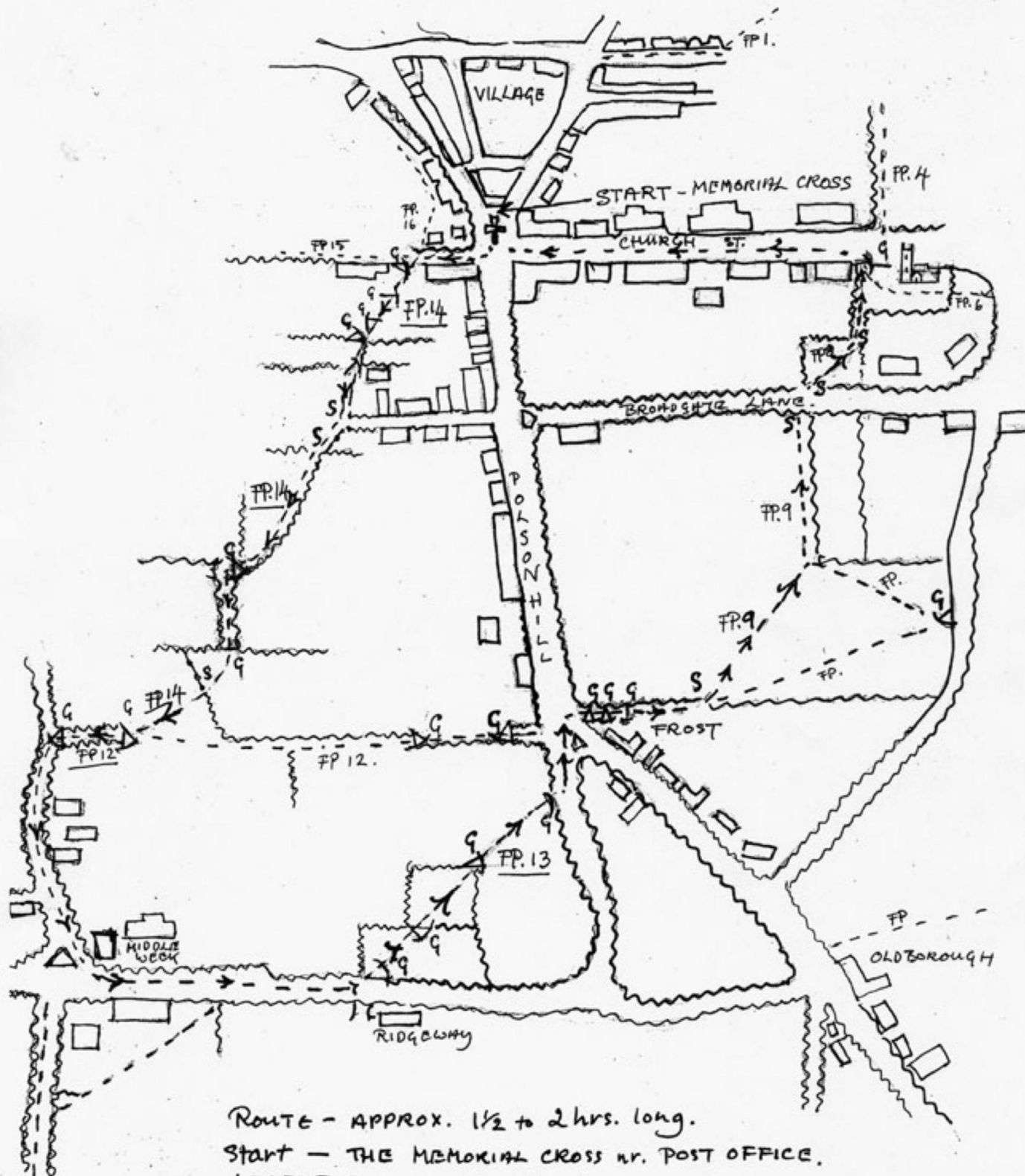

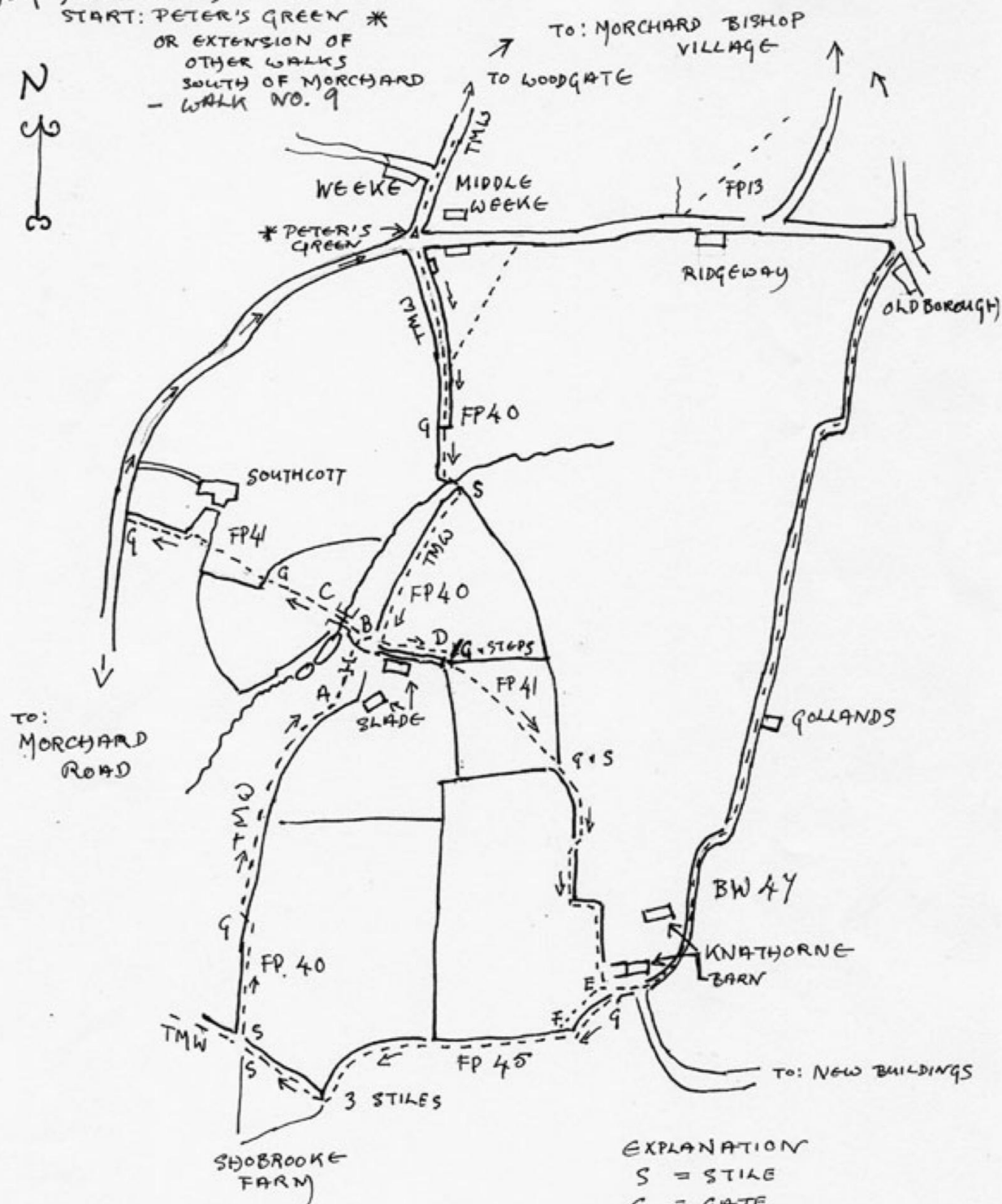
